Participants provided with packets reflecting how participations utilize unique identifiers for programs, staff and children.

Race to the Top-Early Learning Challenge (RTT-ELC) Data Table A(1)13 reviewed for purpose of recording the data that is captured by participating agencies in the use of program, staff and child identifiers.

DPH shared the use of unique identifiers in their birth, newborn screen, lead, and death registries.

SDE shared the use of unique identifiers for programs through a town, institution and school code assignment. The data systems include PKIS, PSIS, and SEDAC that capture varying data elements, and are currently linkable within the agencies.

DSS shared the use of unique identifiers in their Eligibility Management Systems (EMS) for services such as SNAP, TFA and Husky A—Husky B managed by an external contractor. DSS also manages a Medical Management Information System (MMIS) that assigns provider ids randomly.

Child Care 2-1-1 manages the C4K database, as a subcontractor of DSS, assigns child certificate numbers, client ids and provider ids.

Determine the feasibility of adding additional fields to the data system for birth certificate numbers to facilitate linkage between SDE and DPH systems an initial attempt at interoperability.

SDE to follow up with verification of essential data elements captured by PKIS.

DSS to follow up with Teen Pregnancy data and Promoting Responsible Fathers data.

Healthy Start and Child Day also require DSS follow up for possible sources of child, program, and/or staff databases.
