A. Welcome and Introductions

David Title opened the meeting at 9:35 a.m. and introduced Myra Jones-Taylor as the director for the Early Childhood Planning Team. Carlota Schechter (formerly of the Department of Higher Education) and Mara Siladi (former Assistant Superintendent of Stamford) will also join the planning team on a part-time basis. Also introduced was Steve Randazzo from the Governor's Office who has been attending meetings for the Early Childhood Planning team in the interim.

B. Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the March 22, 2012, meeting were approved.

C. Legislative Updates

Harriet Feldlaufer reported that she and members of the State Department of Education's (SDE) legislative office have been reviewing each piece of legislation from the Governor's Education Reform Bill #458 to outline what the necessary tasks are, within what timeframe, and what stakeholders will need to be involved. Key components of bill #458 include: new preschool spaces, T-QRIS, early literacy planning and professional development, early childhood longitudinal systems, and the relationship between age 3 to Grade 3.

Preschool spaces:

A total of 1,000 spaces are available for expansion. All 19 current Priority School Readiness towns will receive additional spaces with 500 spaces allotted for the 10 Education Reform districts, and 250 spaces allotted for the other nine Priority School Readiness districts. An additional 250 spaces will be available for the Competitive School Readiness. New Requests for Proposals (RFPs) from the grant communities will be reviewed by the SDE based on the current grant approval process.

D. Work Group Updates - Sherry Linton-Massiah

Data:

The Data work group is finalizing plans for the Data Systems Roundtable event on June 19, 2012. The morning session will include an end-users panel and the afternoon session will include a response panel. In preparation for this event, the work group continues to participate in semi-monthly planning conference calls with the National Center for Educational Statistics (NCES) State Support Team. The Data Systems Roundtable event is by invitation only.

Workforce/Professional Development:

The Workforce/Professional Development work group is reviewing articulation agreements with the Department of Higher Education. A gap analysis conducted by Connecticut Charts-a-Course to review six sectors of early care and education workforce is underway. The work group is scheduled to present a status update of deliverables at the October 2012 Early Childhood Cabinet meeting.

Early Learning Standards:

The Early Learning Standards work group has been focusing on the review of the SRI report from the Alignment Institute. SRI International will present their report at the June Early Childhood Cabinet meeting.

Family Involvement/Home Visitation:

The Family Involvement/Home Visitation work group has shifted conversations to family engagement to focus on more than just the home visitation aspect. Workgroup volunteers are developing budgets for the cross-training of early childhood education professionals in the areas of domestic violence, special health care and literacy. As communities begin to expand home visiting models using the new home visiting funding, family resources centers have been identified as community resources in connecting families with home visiting services.

QRIS:

The QRIS work group will have its first meeting on Thursday, May 24, 2012. The chairs are Deb Flis and Eileen Ward. The focus of the meeting will be on outlining next steps as well as drafting a work plan.

Health:

The Health work group will be chaired by Grace Whitney. A co-chair has yet to be named, though a membership list has been brought to the leadership team for consideration.

<u>Public/Private Partnerships:</u>

The Public/Private Partnerships work group will be chaired by Anzelmo Graziosi. A co-chair has yet to be named.
